COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT “WORK-LIFE BALANCE IN THE CONTEXT OF CHANGING FAMILIES AND LABOR MARKET IN GREECE – WORLBAL”, EEA CODE GR07/3939”

The Project “Work-life balance in the context of changing families and labor market in Greece» was successfully completed.

This project was co-financed by the Financial Mechanism (FM) of the European Economic Area (EEA), for the period 2009 – 2014, in the Priority area of Academic research.

The main objective of the project was, on the one hand, to document and evaluate working women’s needs and expectations. On the other hand, the overall purpose of this project was to define how working women perceive the reconciliation between work and family life in Greece in a period of economic crisis.

Key project results include mapping of existing policies and good practices regarding reconciliation between work and family life at European, International and National levels, as well as the formulation of practical policy proposals within the scope of application of Greece in crisis - based on the results of qualitative and quantitative research on working mothers.
